We use cookies on our website to help us to enhance your user experience. This policy explains how.

What are cookies?

Cookies are small text files a website might put on your computer or mobile device when you first visit the site or a particular page. The cookie helps the website to recognise your device the next time you visit.

Cookies can:

- help us to remember your preferences
- analyse how well our website is performing
- contain personal information so you don't need to enter it twice (for instance, when you tick the 'Remember Me' box)

What sort of cookies does www.corkbp.ie use?

1st Party Cookies (Our Cookies)

COOKIE name	COOKIE Description
CATEGORY_INFO	Stores the category info on the page to allow pages to display faster.
EXTERNAL_NO_CACHE	A flag indicating whether caching is disabled or not.
FRONTEND	Your session ID on the server.
LAST_CATEGORY	The last category you visited.
LAST_PRODUCT	The most recent product you viewed.
NO_CACHE	Indicates whether cache is allowed.
USER_ALLOWED_SAVE_COOKIE	Indicates whether a customer is allowed to use cookies.
VIEWED_PRODUCT_IDS	The products that you've recently viewed.

3rd Party Cookies (Performance cookies)

Cookies set by Google Analytics are shown in the table below.

These cookies collect information about how visitors use the Website, for instance which pages visitors go to most often, and if they get error messages from web pages. These cookies don't collect information that identifies a visitor. All information these cookies collect is aggregated, therefore anonymous, and is only used to improve how chadwicks.ie works.

COOKIE name	COOKIE Description
__unam	These cookies are used to collect information about how visitors use our website. We use the information to understand what subjects on our website you're interested in and to help us improve the usability of the website. The cookies collect information in an anonymous form - cookies don't identify you- including the number of visitors to the website, where visitors have come to the website from and the pages visited

Can a website user block cookies?

How to enable and disable cookies using your browser

Google Chrome

1. Click the wrench icon on the browser toolbar
2. Select Settings
3. Click 'Show advanced settings'
4. In the "Privacy" section, click the 'Content settings' button
5. To enable cookies in the "Cookies" section, pick 'Allow local data to be set', this will enable both first-party and third-party cookies. To allow only first-party cookies pick 'Block all third-party cookies without exception'
6. To disable cookies, in the "Cookies" section, pick 'Block sites from setting any data'

Microsoft Internet Explorer 6.0, 7.0, 8.0

1. Click 'Tools' at the top of your browser window and select 'Internet Options'
2. In the options window navigate to the 'Privacy' tab
3. To enable cookies: Set the slider to 'Medium' or below
4. To disable cookies: Move the slider to the top to block all cookies

Mozilla Firefox

- Click on 'Tools' at the browser menu and select 'Options'
- Select the Privacy panel
- To enable cookies: Check 'Accept cookies for sites'
- To disable cookies: Uncheck 'Accept cookies for sites'

Opera

- Click on 'Setting' at the browser menu and select 'Settings'
- Select 'Quick Preferences'
- To enable cookies: check "Enable Cookies"
- To disable cookies: uncheck "Enable Cookies"

Safari on OSX

1. Click on 'Safari' at the menu bar and select the 'Preferences' option
2. Click on 'Security'
3. To enable cookies: In the 'Accept cookies' section select 'Only from site you navigate to'
4. To disable cookies: In the 'Accept cookies' section select 'Never'
